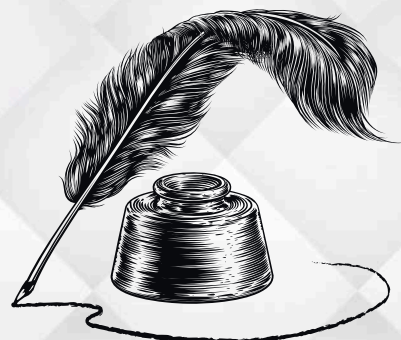

ECOQUEST: THE BIODIVERSITY CHALLENGE

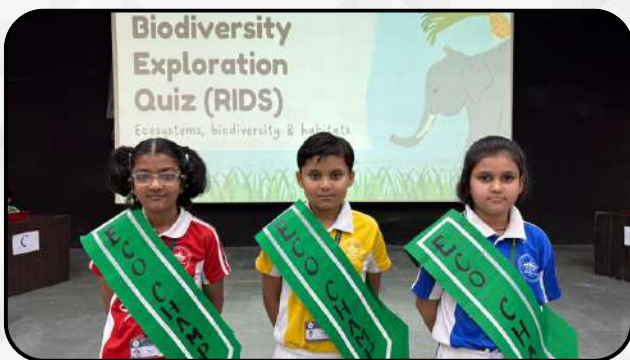
On May 7, 2025, young minds from Grades III to V came together in a vibrant celebration of nature and knowledge through the quiz competition titled "Biodiversity Exploration – A Comparative Analysis."
