Unable to bear this torturous game of this frolicsome wind, the tumultuous cloud, rained down its sorrowful tears,


On to the parched, chapped and cracked earth below.


Also, a well-read person always has more knowledge about various topics which equip that person better for social situations and for holding conversations with groups of people.

RECIPE: RICE BOWL

Ingredients:

Rice, Paneer, Spinach, Onion, Garlic, Chilli flakes, Oregano, Spices, Butter, Salt

Utensils required:

Frying pan, Glass bowl, Spatula, Cauldron

Method of preparation:

- Take a frying pan and add butter to it.
- Stir fry the paneer.
- Cut the stir-fried paneer into pieces and add it into the bowl with chilli flakes, red chilli powder, salt, cilantro, black pepper, and cumin powder and mix well.
- Now cover the lid of the bowl and leave it to marinate for half an hour.
- Roast 3 cloves of garlic and chop the garlic into fine pieces.
- Take a pan and add some butter, little oil, add roasted garlic, chopped onions and cook for 2-3 minutes.

Preparation of White Sauce:

- Take 1 cup all purpose flour and add half a litre of milk and mix well.
- Now add chilli flakes, black pepper, parsley, and oregano.
- Cover the pan with a lid and let the sauce cook for 5 minutes.

Preparation of Rice:

- Cook the paneer from both the sides and dip it in the white sauce.
- In a kadhai/cauldron add some finely chopped garlic and onion and cook for 5 minutes till golden brown and then add the spinach puree to it, add some salt, and chilli flakes, cook it for 10 minutes.
- Now add soaked rice and boil it. Add spinach puree to it and cook for 10 minutes on low flame.
- Take a bowl; add some portion of green rice and some white sauce paneer.
- Enjoy this sumptuous meal! Bon appetite!


