
THE LION & THE JACKAL




SAMAITH walked up to him feeling traumatized, reaching him he said, "You shall DIE!" and boom the robot was in two pieces.

But only if, for every step, students apply reasons.



Sometimes the parents fail to understand the problem their child is going through and when their ward opens up to them they ignore it thinking that it is just an excuse for scoring less marks or not doing good in school.

The goal of this article is to bring attention to the rapidly rising mental health issues. Let us work together in breaking the taboo that having mental illness means you are demented, because you are not, its just like any other illness which can be cured with love and support. Early intervention and improved access to mental health services are vital steps toward ensuring a healthier and more productive academic experience for students.

Just because I am late doesn't mean i haven't won


