
MORAL: Courage means facing fears, not running from it.


AMAZING FACTS ABOUT ANIMALS

STEPHENSON 2-18

RECIPE: HOW TO MAKE GULAB JAMUN

Anikait Mallick, 3-A

Ingredients

- One packet of milkmaid
- Two cups (200g) of flour
- 600 g of grated paneer
- 200 g of suji/rawa
- One and a half tablespoons of baking powder
- One and a half tablespoons of baking soda
- Oil
- Water as required
- A kg of sugar
- Coarsely crushed cardamom (6 to 8 in nos.)



Procedure

STEP 1: Mix sugar and water in a pan and then boil the mixture to prepare the syrup. Once it is done, remove the pan from the stove and add cardamom to the syrup, and allow it to cool for a few minutes.

STEP 2: In a mixing bowl, combine flour, paneer, suji, milkmaid, baking powder, and baking soda. Mix gently to form a soft dough, avoiding over-kneading.

STEP 3: Divide the dough into 30-35 portions and gently shape them into round balls.

STEP 4: Heat the oil on low flame and fry the balls until they are golden brown.

STEP 5: Transfer the fried Gulab Jamun balls into the cooled syrup. After finishing with the immersion of each of the Gulab Jamun balls into the prepared syrup, heat the syrup for a while, and then take them off the stove to be served.

STEP 6: Enjoy your homemade warm Gulab Jamun with your favourite toppings.




अब हम इसे सवारेंगे हमने है प्रण उठाया।











