Once again at the District Level competition held on 18th August 2024, organized by 'Bihar Swimming Association', our swimmers left their mark. Many congratulations to all the participants.



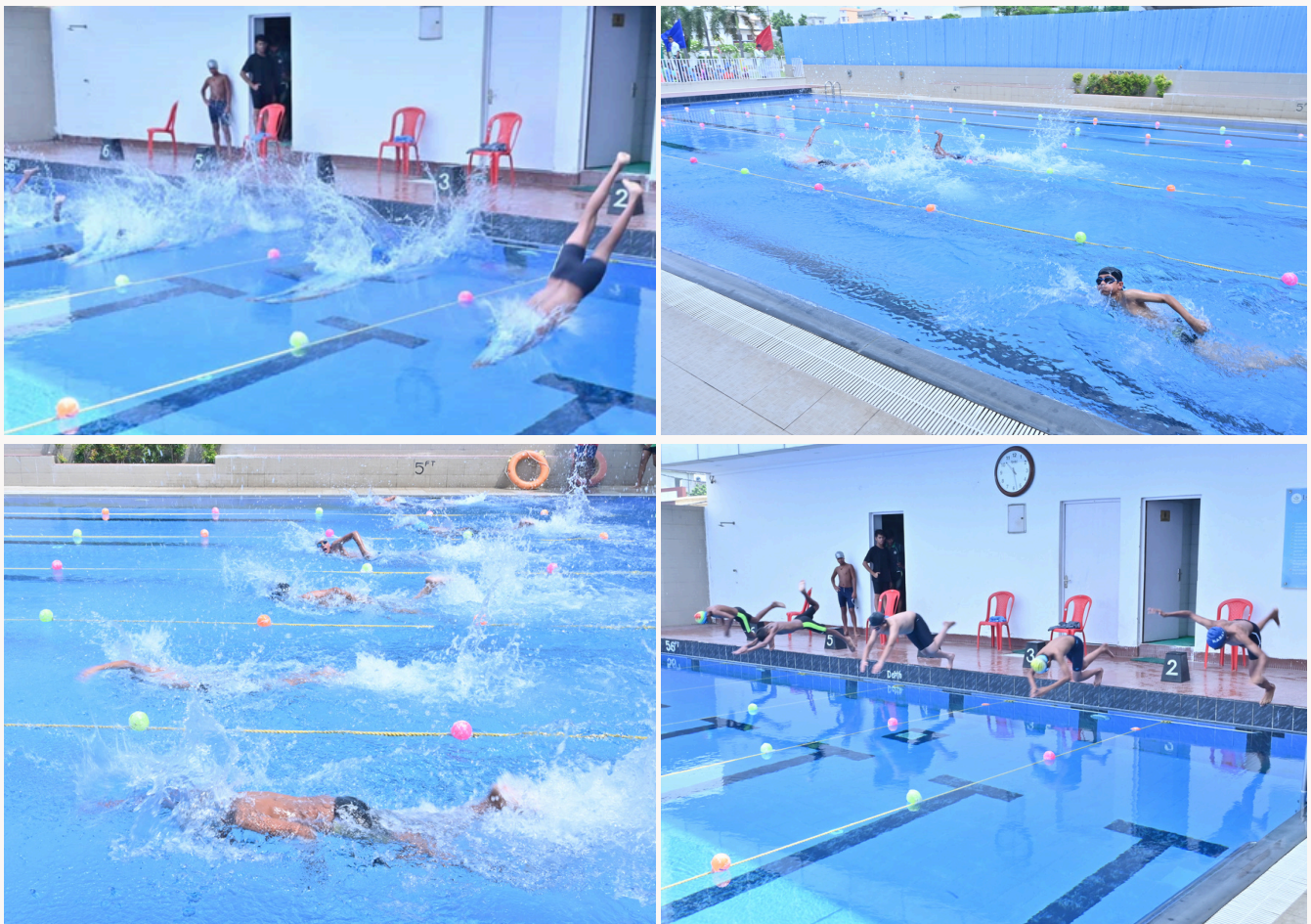
A REMARKABLE OPPORTUNITY

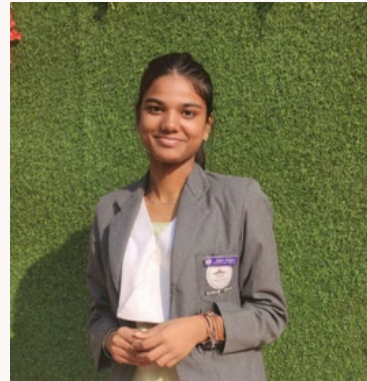
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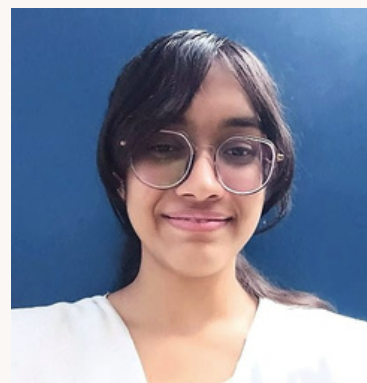
