

Felicitations Ceremony: Echoes of Effort



On 14th May 2025, Litera Valley School witnessed a soul-stirring cultural experience under the SPIC MACAY banner. Grades 6 to 8 had the privilege of engaging with Smt. Kavita Dwibedi, an internationally celebrated Odissi exponent, who transformed the stage into a sacred canvas of storytelling and rhythm.

What unfolded was more than a performance—it was a dance dialogue. Smt. Dwibedi traced the journey of Odissi from its temple roots to the emergence of Gotipua, where young boys in female attire preserved the tradition during the 11th century's political upheavals. She interwove this with India's diverse classical tapestry—from Kathak to Mohiniyattam—explaining how classical and folk forms differ in lineage, training, and purpose.

Each segment of her presentation was a visual and emotional revelation—from the Mangalacharan (prayer dance) to the depiction of Odisha's temple life, the structural elegance of Chowka and Tribhangi, and a final Abhinaya that brought nature and narrative to life.

The performance was enriched by live music from Manas Sarangi (Mardal), Narayan Jena (Vocal), and Pradip Maharana (Violin), creating a synergy of sound and movement that captivated every heart.

Far beyond an artistic show, this event was a celebration of heritage, a lesson in devotion, and a dance of divinity that left the audience enlightened and inspired.

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
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
