Our Journey with Aakash Robotics

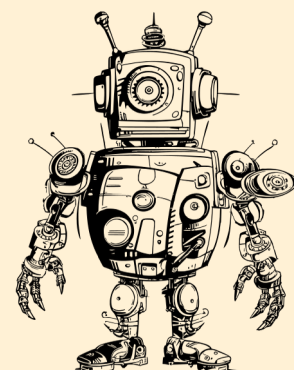
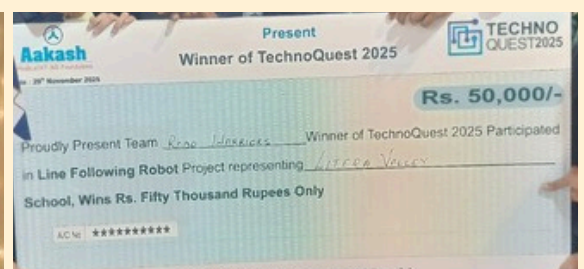
